I would like to welcome all of the students and families back and thank you for helping us get back into our regular routine at Mother Teresa Middle School. It is hard to believe we have only two months left of the school year. As the Director of Student Supports, I am going to focus on a few key areas: **attendance, high school placements, mentoring, enrichment programming, and the current recruiting.**

Our attendance for the month of April was 92.39%. Our overall attendance for the year is 95.39%. We have two months left to reach our school goal of 97%. I believe we can still achieve this goal if we continue to focus on working as a **TEAM**. To help us reach this goal, we will be rewarding students who achieve 100% attendance for April, May, and June. We have also organized a competition where the grades will compete with each other for the best attendance for the next two months. I would like to thank the parents/guardians for their continued support. Let's work hard to make our goal of 97% happen.

We have 16 grade 8 students transitioning to high school this year. Currently, we have 7 students who will attend Miller High School, 4 students attending Luther High School, 3 students attending Notre Dame, and 2 students attending Archbishop M.C. O'Neill. I would like to thank the administration and counsellors from each of the respective schools for their help and support of our students. They have made the transition to high school much easier and I will continue to work closely with them to ensure the success of our students. Thank you to parents/guardians and the mentors for your support as well. Our mentors have committed to be positive role models and assist our students in grade 9 next year. **Our "Grade 8 Farewell Celebration" is scheduled to be held at Mother Teresa Middle School on Saturday, June 21st from 1:00-3:30pm.** We will have more details at the **Grade 8 parent/guardian meeting on Thursday, May 15th.** It is important for all grade 8 parents/guardians to **attend this meeting.** A meeting for all parents/guardians will be held on June 19th. I would like to thank **Mr. Maurice Laprairie** for providing the opportunity for our students and their families to get pictures during this event. This special day is very important to us, as it will be the first class transitioning to high school.

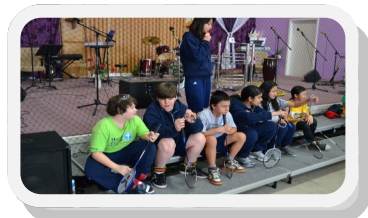
