Thank you to all of our families for getting your child/children on the bus every morning. Being at school is essential to academic success. For this school year we are at 94.91%. Our goal is 97% and to achieve this goal we need to have every MTMS student at school EVERYDAY for the next 5 months. We believe that this is possible if we continue to work as a team.

We had a great turnout for our February "For the Love of Reading" Parent Meeting. To all those who attended, Thank YOU! Research shows that parent engagement matters. Study after study has shown us that student achievement improves when parents play an active role in their children's education. Students are more likely to be motivated, to earn higher grades, to have better behaviour and social skills, and to continue their education to a higher level when their parents are actively engaged in supporting their success at school.

MTMS STUDENTS are ACADEMIC CHAMPIONS

AT MTMS we embrace a "GROWTH MINDSET". Our 6th, 7th and 8th grade scholars continue to strengthen and grow their academic skills. We are proud to report that our Canadian Achievement Test (CAT) results show that our 8th grade students are meeting the Canadian Norms in Reading, Writing and Math Concepts.

We will continue to work on strengthening our math computation skills and could use your help.

We are looking for "MATH TUTORS" to assist us during our STUDY HALL, as directed by our academic staff, from 3:15 to 4:15; Monday to Thursday.

The commitment could be one hour a week and up to 4. "Every Minute Counts" at MTMS so we are very flexible and work around our volunteers schedules. MTMS math tutors would help our students complete math assignments as well as playing games to learn math facts by memory, particularly multiplication facts to 12. Our math tutors have worked one on one with students as well as with small groups. We want all of our students to be achieving 90% or better in their reading comprehension; 100%...100% of the time. In October, we had 81% of our students meeting this goal. We are getting very close to our goal with 95% of the MTMS student body at or above 90% in their reading comprehension.

We believe that all students can learn and every minute counts. We believe that setting high expectations enables us to meet our goals.

TRANSITIONS, DISCERNMENT AND ADMISSIONS

Our 9th grade students are into their second semester. We would like to thank all the high schools and our mentors for supporting our Grade 9's, especially during the most difficult times. Together, we will make a difference and change lives.

Our current 8th grade students are discerning which high school will be the best fit; they have been touring schools and working through their "Transition Document" with Mr. Rieder, Mr. Gonzales and Ms. Schmidt. We know how important it is to take the time to discern together with family, MTMS staff and mentors as each student makes this very important decision in their transition to high school.

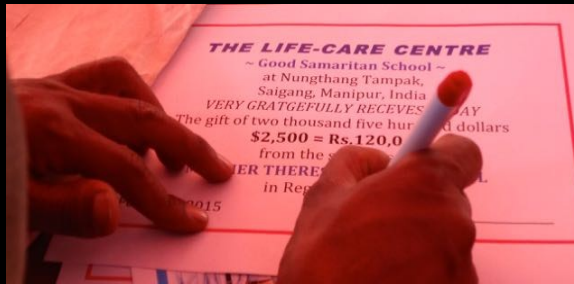
